

## WAKESHMA TOWNSHIP BOARD MEETING

April 1, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Supervisor Gatlin, following an Active Assailant program that was presented to the community by Lt. Troy Faulk of the Kalamazoo County Sheriff's Department, with approximately a dozen citizens in attendance. ### CITIZENS COMMENTS:

The recent fire at the old Masonic Temple was questioned - waiting on results of asbestos testing have to come back before any further action can be taken. State Fire Marshal is still investigating the fire. There is some concern as neighborhood kids have been getting in there and could possibly get hurt. It will be brought to attention that it needs to be boarded up at least at the bottom half where kids would have access.
